RTIP STUDENTS LEARN ABOUT SIMULCASTING REPORT ANALYSIS FROM CHRIMS PRESIDENT



Tucson, AZ — Mark Thurman, President and CEO of CHRIMS, traveled to Tucson to speak with University of Arizona Race Track Industry Program students on his company's role as a technology solutions provider for the pari-mutuel industry.

Thurman spoke in the Race Track Organization, Structure, & Financial Management course, where he gave a brief history of simulcasting before explaining simulcasting reports in detail. He highlighted the opportunities available for students that understand wagering data analysis while also emphasizing the complexities of settlements between tracks in different jurisdictions governed by varying rules and regulations.

Students were appreciative of this knowledge as it ties in with a project they have been working on for the class, in which they must evaluate an import simulcast schedule for efficiency of operation and make decisions regarding which signals to keep and drop.
